

ALBERTANS' AVERSION TO TAXES

- Land of opportunity -where future (hopefully) takes care of itself_
- Boom city build, build, build, harvest, extract- then pay later
- Bust- payback and over-dependence on government (and Ottawa?)
- Alberta exceptionalism
 - "Have"- not a "have not"
 - We're special= superior
 - Don't need to pay taxes? Or shouldn't
- Alberta's tax advantage
- Political opportunism- "taxes will only go one way- down!"

ALBERTA'S FISCAL DILEMMA- EXCELLENT PUBLIC SERVICES AND LOW TAXES

- GOOD TIMES Government deliver
 - roads, telephones, electricity, irrigation canals, railways
 - "too much" government revenue
 - widening benefits to general population and business
 - lower taxes!

- BAD TIMES- Government deliver
 - Relief to unemployed
 - subsidies to business, bailouts
 - health care
 - housing supports
 - No tax increases- we can't inflict

- Budgetary spending, including wages
- Tax policy
- Health and education delivery
- Minimum wage
- Occupational health and safety
- Investment policies
- Energy and environmental regulation

- Oil and natural gas prices
- Exchange rate
- Interest rates
- Banking
- Interprovincial and international pipelines
- Bankruptcy
- Railways
- Telecommunications
- Equalization

ALBERTA'S BURNING PLATFORM

- Interview with David Dodge- 7 February 2019
- "We had to get people to understand [. . .] that this essential platform on which the Government of Alberta had operated really wasn't going to be viable over the long run." For Dodge, the economic argument around resource revenue is not that the resources themselves will run out, but that "the economic value of the resource will come down because there would be alternatives developed." To maintain the income and lifestyle to which Albertans have become accustomed, p. 173.

- Public debate
- But why would politicians even contemplate?
 - No choice- Mel's chapter
- Public opinion shifting- lower PIT or use for health services?
- Myth –busting is key
- Politicians actually would love to have more revenue flexibility-Thomson's chapter
